

Assistance League® of Corvallis Whistle Blower Policy

(Adopted: April, 2010)

If a member reasonably believes that some policy, practice, or activity of Assistance League of Corvallis (hereafter ALC) is in violation of law, a written complaint must be filed by that member with the President.

It is the intent of ALC to adhere to all laws and to regulations that apply to the organization. The underlying purpose of this policy is to support the organization's goal of legal compliance. The support of all members is necessary to achieve compliance with various laws and regulations.

ALC will not retaliate against a member who, in good faith, on the basis of a reasonable belief that the practice is in violation of law or a clear mandate of public policy has made a protest or raised a complaint against some practice of ALC, or of another individual or entity with whom ALC has a business relationship.

ALC will not retaliate against members who disclose or threaten to disclose to an officer or the ALC Board or to a public body any activity, policy, or practice of ALC that the member reasonably believes is in violation of a law or a rule or regulation mandated pursuant to law or is in violation of a clear mandate of public policy concerning human or animal health, safety, and welfare, or protection of the environment.
